RE: Top Foreign Policy Priorities

On behalf of the President of the United States, I am seeking your input in prioritizing our current foreign policy issues. At your earliest convenience, please send us a memo with following:

- 1. A summary of three major foreign policy issues, and how each issue relates to U.S. vital national interests.
- 2. A recommendation of one "soft" and one "hard" tool to add to POTUS's foreign policy strategy for each issue.
- 3. Two astute questions POTUS should consider when deciding how to proceed with each issue.
- 4. Your opinion as to what role Congress and POTUS should each play in foreign policy according to the U.S. Constitution.
- 5. Your opinion as to the knowledge and temperament required to be the Commander-in-Chief.

POTUS and my fellow members of the National Security Council thank you for your service and eagerly await your recommendations.
